
### PANELISTS



**Rev. Juan Antonio Cabrera Montero, OSA** is an Augustinian priest born in Madrid (Spain) in 1972. He studied Library and Documentation Science at the Complutense University of Madrid and later obtained a doctorate in Theology and Patristic Sciences at the Patristic Institute Augustinianum of Rome. He was the librarian of that Institute from 2005 to 2016 and has been vice president since 2016.



**Catherine Conybeare** was educated in Classics at Oxford and in Medieval Studies at Toronto; she has been at Bryn Mawr College since 2002. Her research centres on late antiquity, and especially the writings of Augustine of Hippo. She has written four monographs, including *The Irrational Augustine* (2006), and more than seventy articles and reviews on such topics as aurality, touch, violence, and the self.



**Rev. Gary N. McCloskey, O.S.A.** is a researcher/educator focusing on both the Pedagogy of Saint Augustine of Hippo and the practice of Instructional Technology. He has been a teacher and administrator in higher education as well as teacher on middle and secondary levels. In addition to publications, he has shared research findings and provided teacher professional development on 6 of the 7 continents.



**Joseph Kelley** is Professor of Religious and Theological Studies at Merrimack College. He studied philosophy and languages at Villanova University, theology at the Catholic University of America and earned a doctorate in the Psychology of Religion at Boston University. He is a clinical psychologist, and the author of many articles and six books, including two introductory texts to the thought of Saint Augustine of Hippo.



**Dr. Moez Mediouni** is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Sfax in Tunisia. He is a scholar with expertise on the long philosophical tradition in Carthage, including Saint Augustine, Saint Cyprian and Tertullian. He has also written on the importance of Saint Augustine for analyzing the writings of 20th century European philosophers such as Hannah Arendt, and Jacques Derrida regarding their thought as it relates to St. Augustine.
